Gateway Garden Has Been Transformed!

Avant Gardening & Landscaping's design dramatically transformed the area into a small urban park for pedestrians and bicyclists. Regrading eliminated the large, curved flower bed and created a larger space toward E. Wilson Street for a seating area. Retaining walls, a patio, and seating areas have been created. Several gravel pathways lead to the seating areas. Oak trees, a coffee tree, serviceberries, sumac, asters, goldenrod, and over 100 little bluestem grasses were planted in raised beds.
